Do you have any pets?


I have a dog named Scott.

Also she spoke very good Spanish, so it was amazing to me. We always sang a song about cleanliness. I also remember that her classes were always vivacious, with music and stories. Until one day we did not see her again. Then sometimes I remembered her classes that were super fun.

I didn't know Mike very well; I saw him sometimes at CMT and I knew he was my sister Lorena's teacher, in the subject of mathematics. She said he was very good, and that he was passionate about mathematics. Sometime later we withdrew from CMT. Many years went by until I entered the university and I had a little more contact because Margarita and Mike had contact with Lorena, so we saw them sometimes, usually at picnics. I remember that one day while I was studying my preparatory level for my career in Chemical Engineering, I remember that Margarita and Mike invited me to a McDonald's where they asked me how I was doing, both in my personal life and in my studies. I thought that between university and my job, I couldn't do it all, but I did it and today I'm in my third semester, in the career of teaching.

The most memorable moment for me was seeing them again and I'm referring to the fact of seeing them up close talking with them about your life, your experiences. Receiving classes with Mike about geometry for me was something very memorable because it impressed me how he developed in the subjects with numbers and the very noble gesture of elaborating a whole manual for me where he explained step by step how to understand the "algebraic language". As well as listening to Margarita's stories, they are so interesting and with her touch of warmth. Another memorable moment is when I failed in my first two paths.. DEOF never abandoned me, they always reminded me that even if the situation is difficult, I can count on them, with their help and support. DEOF means a great opportunity to be part of a great family, a family made up of people with excellent values, who support you in difficult moments and adversity, who listen to you and encourage you, and who celebrate with you in those moments of triumph.

COVID Disruption

I, together with my co-workers, thought we would also be part of the lockdown, but it was not so. Because we belong to a strategic sector, we work in person. My biggest fear was how to get to work and return home. Because I live far from work and almost no one went to the area where I lived, and also because each time I returned different ways. Sometimes walking, sometimes in a van, or a taxi, but taking a taxi was too expensive since cab drivers had raised their fares and didn't allow over two passengers.

Also, our schedules were modified, and I worked from early in the morning until 3 or 4 in the afternoon, which was a good thing since I left early, but it didn't change the fact that I wondered how I would get home. I was working Monday through Friday, but my partner who worked on weekends quit for fear of getting infected, since there was a pregnant person in his family and since there was no experienced staff I had to cover his place. I felt that my week never ended and I remember that, within a month and a half, I was exhausted, because I also started college. I remember telling my parents that I didn't want to go anymore, that I wanted them to include us in the quarantine, but I had to go. There was a certain time when the government instituted exclusive buses for people who worked in the middle of the quarantine.
